Maximum CDBG Grant Amount: \$ 650,000.00

CDBG Categories:

- 1. Housing Rehabilitation** – Rehab/replacement of owner occupied Low to Moderate Income (LMI) homes.
- 2. Commercial Revitalization** – Streetscape, Building Façade work, etc. to the Downtown Commercial Area. City Wide/Service Area needs to be a minimum of 51% LMI. The City of Dunnellon is 45.81% LMI by Census.
- 3. Neighborhood Revitalization-** Infrastructure items in residential LMI areas. Examples – water line repair/replacement, sewer line repair/replacement, water system improvements, sewer system improvements, paving, drainage, community center, etc. Beneficiaries must be at minimum 51% LMI in each Service Area to meet Application Threshold Requirements
- 4. Economic Development** – Provide infrastructure on City easement/property to a new business or expansion of existing business. Business must create new long term jobs and be included as the developer in the application. Can apply for up to \$1,500,000.00 under this category only

Additional Points in Application:

➤ **Leverage Points:**

Each \$ 1,000.00 of leverage results in 1 extra point in final score of the application. Maximum of 25 points or \$ 25,000.00. Local community can exceed \$25,000.00 towards projects but will not receive additional points for leverage over the 25 point maximum.

➤ **Neighborhood Revitalization and Commercial Revitalization Projects Only:**

Engineer stamped construction plans and specifications submitted with the application by the application deadline will receive an additional 100 points for being shovel ready. All permits must be submitted for prior to application submittal to obtain these points.

- Local Government will not be reimbursed for shovel ready design cost with CDBG funds, even if application is funded.



Steps Required in CDBG Application Process

- 1.) City Council appoint a Citizens Advisory Task Force (CATF).
- 2.) Advertise and hold a CATF meeting discuss possible projects.
- 3.) Advertise and hold a 1st Public Hearing. Obtain public comment and direction by City Council to move forward on developing an application for a project.
- 4.) Advertised and hold a Fair Housing Workshop at City Council Meeting.
- 5.) Advertised and hold a 2nd Public Hearing, in front of City Council finalize and submit application prior to the February 16, 2017 deadline

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CITY OF DUNNELLON FIRST PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

The City of Dunnellon is considering applying to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) for a FFY 2016 Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). The City is eligible to apply for up to Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$650,000.00) in the neighborhood revitalization, commercial revitalization, and housing rehabilitation categories and up to one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000.00) in the economic development category. Construction activities funded through the CDBG program must meet one of the following National Objectives:

1. Provide benefit to low and moderate income persons;
2. Prevent or eliminate slum or blight conditions or
3. Meet other community development needs of recent origin having a particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community and where other financial resources are not available to meet such needs.

The type of activities for which CDBG may be used for include constructing storm water ponds, paving roads and sidewalks, installing sewer and water lines, building a community center, or park, making improvements to a sewage treatment plant, and rehabilitation of homes occupied by low income households. Additional activities CDBG funds may be used for include acquisition of real property, loans to private-for-profit business, purchase of machinery and equipment, construction of infrastructure, rehabilitation of commercial buildings, and energy conservation. Additional information regarding the range of activities that may be undertaken will be provided at the public hearing. For each activity that is proposed, at least 70% of the funds must benefit low and moderate income persons.

In developing a CDBG application for submission to DEO, the City of Dunnellon must plan to minimize displacement of persons as a result of planned CDBG activities. In addition, the City of Dunnellon is required to develop a plan to assist displaced persons.

A public hearing to receive citizen views concerning the community's economic and community development needs will be held on Wednesday, December 7, 2016 at 5:30 p.m. or as soon thereafter as possible at the City of Dunnellon City Hall located at 20750 River Drive, Dunnellon, Florida. 



Dawn,

I understand that the City is interested in pursuing a CBDG grant in the amount of \$650,000 to pave roadway within the historic section of the City's CRA. If the grant is awarded, the City's contribution would be \$25,000.

You inquired as to whether there would be a problem under Section 41 of the City Charter if the City were to accept grant funds to construct the roadway without assessing property owners abutting the improved roadway for their pro rata share of the City's expenditure. Section 41 essentially states that when City Council shall determine to construct, grade, or repair any street, the City may have such work done and the amount expended shall be a lien on the lots fronting or abutting the constructed street with the property owners on each side of the street each paying 1/3 of the cost of the improvements and the City paying 1/3.

Section 41 contemplates creation of an automatic lien on the abutting property owners, which "...**may** be enforced or recovered...as provided for in Florida Statutes."

Per Section 41 an automatic lien would be created on the abutting property owners property per their 1/3 pro rata share of the City's expenditure. However, as stated above, Section 41 states that such a lien "...**may** be enforced or recovered..." rather than "**shall**." It is my opinion that the use of the permissive word "may" provides the City the ability to make a determination to release and discharge the automatic liens in the event the City receives a windfall grant for roadway improvements.

If the road is primarily constructed using CBDG funds and the City wishes to release the abutting property owners from the automatic liens contemplated by Section 41 of the Charter it may do so. This release can be accomplished by resolution following construction of the roadway improvements.

The Citizens Advisory Task Force met on Thursday, December 1, 2016 to review the grant categories and make a recommendation to City Council. After much deliberation, the board voted unanimously to recommend five roads (St. Lawrence Drive, St. Benedict Drive, St. George Drive, St. Augustine Drive and St. Patrick Drive) in Dunnellon Heights Subdivision as depicted in the engineering data be paved in their entirety and any remaining grant dollars be used to pave roads and improve utilities in the Historical District that are in the worst condition and would meet the grant criteria. A combination of projects in the two areas that best meet the grant criteria is recommended so long as a priority is given to Dunnellon Heights. The committee felt that such an improvement to Dunnellon Heights would attract those people looking to build a moderate home in Dunnellon, thereby increasing property tax revenue to the City, and providing future consumers of Dunnellon's commercial district.
