City seeks residents for new project committees

ow should a newly revitalized East Pennsylvania Avenue streetscape look?

Would you like to assist the city in developing these plans?

We are establishing a committee of property and business owners along East Pennsylvania to give input to the city on the design and implementation of this project.

East Pennsylvania is the first phase of the streetscaping project that was identified in the recently adopted Bicycle/Pedestrian Master Plan.

The plan calls for trail connections, safe sidewalks for school children and other pedestrians and streetscaping of Pennsylvania Avenue and U.S. 41/Williams . The streetscaping concept includes new sidewalks, trees, lighting and benches.

The proposed implementation is divided into five areas, which includes:

 East Pennsylvania between the railroad and Rainbow River

- West Pennsylvania between U.S. 41/Williams St. and Cedar
- The intersection of U.S 41 and Pennsylvania Avenue
- U.S. 41 south of Pennsylvania to the Withlacoochee River
- U.S. 41 north of Pennsylvania to Brooks Street.

In addition to the committee working on the East Pennsylvania Avenue corridor, the city is also forming a Recreation Advisory Committee.

Several residents have signed up to serve and the first meeting will be scheduled in the near future. This committee will identify recreation needs of the community.

The city is in negotiations with the state to lease 170 acres for recreational purposes. This committee will also identify facilities that could go on this property.

ENJOY BOATING WITH SAFETY TIPS

Dunnellon Police
Department's Marine Unit often
conducts random Safety
Inspections. Follow these tips
and you will have a safe and
enjoyable time on the rivers of
Dunnellon.

- 1. Remember the entire Rainbow River is Idle Speed/No Wake which means a vessel cannot proceed at a speed greater than that speed which is necessary to maintain steerageway. Be cautious as there are a lot of tubers enjoying the river this time of year.
- 2. Absolutely no alcohol and/or disposable containers permitted on the Rainbow River. Pack all foods and drinks in Tupperware type containers to avoid getting a ticket. It is also a good idea to remove all stickers and price tags from

your tubes, noodles etc. as these often fall off during the journey down the river.

3. Make a mental safety equipment checklist: This should include the following:

Lifejackets (children under 6 years of age must wear a life jacket while the vessel is underway)

Fire Extinguisher
Sound Producing Device –
a whistle, horn or bell
Throwable Life Preserver
